

TOPICAL STEROID THERAPY

I have prescribed a topical steroid treatment for your condition. This handout is designed to help you get good results and minimize side effects from the medicine. Topical steroids are anti-inflammatories used in a wide range of skin disorders. Inflammation is "swelling with immune cells (white blood cells)" in the skin; topical steroids penetrate the skin and send a strong message to these cells that makes them stop working.

- 1. Apply the medicine **once a day** to the affected area only. ** If you have a lot of small bumps or patches you can apply the medicine all over the affected area; it is too hard to spot treat.
- 2. Use a thin layer, there is no need to glob it on.
- 3. Use the medication 2-4 weeks until the area is flat or until the redness is gone.
- 4. If you have a condition that is chronic (psoriasis, eczema, etc.) you will need to re-treat the affected areas with the medicine: I recommend weekends only for maintenance. This will prevent long term side effects and medicine resistance.
